Objectives and Investment Policy

The Fund’s investment objective is to deliver capital growth over the medium to long term by investing in a portfolio of global equity securities.

The Fund’s objective may be achieved primarily through investment up to 100% of net assets in global equities and equity-related securities (including common stock, preference and convertible preference shares, American depository receipts and global depository receipts, equity linked notes and rights) of resilient large cap companies (with a market capitalisation greater than \$5 billion), which are listed on a recognized exchange worldwide, or subject to certain restrictions, which are not listed on a recognized exchange. In normal market conditions, it is expected that the Fund will be close to fully invested in equity and equity-related securities.

The Fund may also use financial derivative instruments (forwards in equity, debt, and currency markets) for efficient portfolio management purposes including for hedging purposes, subject to the conditions and within the limits laid down by the Central Bank. Financial derivative instruments may be traded on a recognised exchange or over-the-counter.

The Fund is considered to be actively managed without reference to any benchmark.

During periods of exceptional financial market stress or equity market volatility, the Fund may invest up to 100% of net assets in debt and debt-related securities (comprising fixed or floating rate bonds, fixed rate, floating rate and variable rate notes, and debentures) issued by governments or corporations with a credit rating or an implied credit rating of “investment grade” at the time of investment by Standard & Poors, Moody’s or Fitch Ratings Limited.

This Share Class will not pay a dividend. Any income arising from the Fund will be reinvested to grow the value of your investment.

The Fund is suitable for investors seeking medium to long-term capital appreciation and who have a high risk investment profile.

The Fund may also invest up to 10% of its Net Asset Value in the units and/or shares of collective investment schemes, including money market funds and exchange traded funds (which are eligible for investment by a UCITS) in accordance with the requirements of the Central Bank.

You may buy and sell shares in the Fund on each business day in Ireland on which banks in Ireland are open for business.

The Fund may hedge currency exposure arising from security positions held by the Fund. The Fund may be exposed to all currencies both OECD and non-OECD, through both purchases and sales of securities. Up to 20% of net assets may be held in cash and ancillary liquid assets for cash management purposes, as cover for financial derivative instrument

Risk and Reward Profile of the Fund



- Interest Rate Risk – the value of the Fund’s fixed income investments may change adversely due to a change in current or expected interest rates.

The risk indicator is determined using historical data or, where historical data is not available, using simulated historical data. Historical data, such as is used in calculating the synthetic indicator, may not be a reliable indication of the future risk profile of the Fund. The risk category shown is not a target or a guarantee and may change over time. A category 1 fund is not risk free, the risk of loss is small but the chance of making gains may also be limited. With a category 7 fund, the risk of losing money is high but so also is the possibility of making gains. **The risk indicator for the Fund is set at 6 as this reflects the market risk arising from proposed investments.**

- Liquidity Risk - the risk stemming from the lack of marketability of an investment that cannot be bought or sold quickly enough to prevent or minimise a loss.

- Investment Risk - There is no guarantee that the investment objective of the Fund will be achieved. A capital loss of some or all of the amount invested may occur.

The Fund does not offer any capital guarantee or assurance that the investor will receive a fixed amount when redeeming.

- Currency Risk - the Fund may be exposed to currency risk in relation to the valuation of assets held in currencies other than its base currency.

In addition to the risk captured by the indicator, the overall Fund value may be considerably affected by:

- Derivatives Risk - Derivatives are highly sensitive to changes in the value of the assets they are based on. The use of derivatives may result in gains or losses that are greater than the original amount invested.

- Market Risk - the Fund invests in shares of companies, and the value of these shares can be negatively affected by changes in the company or its industry or the economy in which it operates.

- Counterparty Risk - The insolvency of any institutions providing services, such as safekeeping of assets or acting as counterparty to derivatives or other instruments, may expose the Fund to financial loss.

- Common Stocks Risk - The value of a company’s stock may fall as a result of factors relating directly to that company, such as decisions made by its management or lower demand for the company’s products or services. A stock’s value may also fall because of factors affecting not just the company, but companies in the same industry or in a number of different industries, such as increases in production costs. The value of a company’s stock may also be affected by changes in financial markets that are relatively unrelated to the company or its industry, such as changes in interest rates or currency exchange rates.
